

## **Obituary – Prof Neuse**




It is with great sadness that the University has learnt of the passing of Professor Eberhard Neuse who died on 10 February 2014 at the age of 88 at his home in Blairgowrie after a long battle with cancer. An Arated Professor of Polymer Chemistry, Neuse spent many years in the Wits School of Chemistry. He will be remembered for his dedication to science research and his devotion to his students of whom he was extremely proud.

Born on the 7<sup>th</sup> of March 1925 in Berlin, Germany, Neuse obtained his BSc (1948), MSc (1951), PhD (1953) in Hannover, Germany and his DSc (1976) at Wits. He joined Wits in 1971 as a Reader in Polymer Chemistry (then as Professor of Macromolecular Chemistry) and continued his research activities as an Honorary Professorial Fellow until 2012. He has been an Emeritus Professor at Wits since 1991. His key research area focused on polymeric anti-cancer drugs. He remained active and supervised various students until 2012. Since 1974, he graduated at least 15 PhD and at least 22 Masters students. His last student graduated in 2013.

Neuse has held his A-rating since 1984 and was an internationally recognised researcher with over 200 publications, patents, book chapters and refereed conference papers. The National Convention for SACI 2013 was held 1-6th December, 2013, at River Park, East London. A total of 263 people attended the conference of which 248 were registered delegates. The remaining 15 people were resource persons such as drivers, WSU cooperate team (who assisted with registration, media etc). 85% of the delegates were from South Africa, while the remaining 15% came from India, Nigeria, Egypt, Mauritius, France, Italy, Finland and Sweden. Five (5) exhibitors were also present throughout the duration of the conference. 221 abstracts were received out of which 203 was accepted for either oral or poster presentation.

The convention was graced with 28 invited speakers, 108 oral speakers and 95 poster presenters. The fields covered include; Inorganic Chemistry, Physical Chemistry, Organic Chemistry, Environmental/Analytical Chemistry, Fluorine Chemistry, Chemical Engineering and Chemical Education.

The largest group was the Analytical/ Environmental group followed by the Organic group and Physical chemistry group. The Chemical Education group was poorly represented. Fluorine/Chemical Engineering group turnout was noteworthy and this group brought in a new perspective into SACI convention.

#### Arrival and Evening Welcome Function

The registration and ice-breaker was held at Golf Club, East London from about 3 to 8pm. Registration was smooth with very little hiccups - with few omissions of names. This was sorted out on the basis of proof of payment as most of the omission was due to last minute payment. Student accommodation was a serious challenge as the Backpacker Hotel which was booked for 68 students was not habitable. The picture of the rooms and facilities on ground was a great variance to the impression we saw on the internet and telephone. The students were immediately moved to Mimosa, Osner and Protea Hotels at a reasonable cost while we requested for the full refund of the deposit paid to Backpacker Hotel. The welcome function was chaired by the Eastern Cape SACI President Prof Zeni Tshentu. The Acting Vice Chancellor of Walter Sisulu University was on ground to welcome the delegates with a short opening speech.

#### Opening Ceremony and Gold Medal Award

The opening session which was held at river Park witnessed dignitaries such as Honourable Minister of Science and Technology Mr Dereck Hanekom, Walter Sisulu University Administrator Prof Van Staden, representatives of the Mayor of Buffalo Municipality and the Premiere of the Eastern Cape Province. Media – SABC 3, Daily Dispatch, Radio FM and Eastern Cape Radio Station were present. The Honourable Minister and the WSU administrator centred on the need for new innovation and collaboration. Prof T Nyokong (2012 Gold medal recipient) and Prof B Klumperman (2013 Gold medal recipient) delivered their stimulating "gold" lectures.

Transport was available all through the conference to pick and drop-off delegates from their various accommodation to the conference venue and the airport.



#### THE JAMES MOIR MEDALS

The medals shall be known as <u>The James Moir Medals of the South African Chemical Institute</u>. The medals are struck in bronze, and bear the Institute's name and crest on the obverse, and the name of the medal together with the name of the recipient and the date on the reverse. Medals shall be awarded to the best BSc Honours student in chemistry at each University and University of Technology. <u>To be eligible</u> <u>for the award the student must have achieved a minimum final pass mark of 75%</u>, One medal shall be available for award annually for each University and University of Technology in the Republic of South Africa. The medal shall be accompanied by a suitably inscribed scroll.

#### PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATION/APPLICATION

The merits of the work of candidates may be brought to the notice of the Council by the Heads of the Departments of Chemistry who desire to recommend

#### THE GOLD MEDAL

The medal shall be known as the Gold Medal of the South African Chemical Institute. The medal is gold-plated, and bears the Institute's name and crest on the obverse, and the name of the medal, together with the name of the recipient and the date on the reverse. The award shall be made to a person whose scientific contributions in the field of chemistry or chemical technology are adjudged to be of outstanding merit. The medal shall be accompanied by a monetary award to the value of R5000, together with a suitably inscribed scroll.

#### THE RAIKES MEDAL


The medal shall be known as <u>The Raikes Medal of the South African Chemical Institute</u>. The medal is gold-plated, and bears a likeness of Humphrey Rivaz Raikes with his name on the obverse, and candidates (nominations).

Nominations should be received by the Institute not later than 31 March 2014.

The Council may at its discretion suspend any or all of these awards in any year in which there are no suitable candidates.







the Institute's name and crest, and the name of the recipient and the date on the reverse. The award shall be made to a person, under the age of 40 on 31 December proceeding the year of the award, whose original chemical research shows outstanding promise, as judged by the person's publications in reputable journals. It is further stipulated that the research shall have been performed in South Africa. The medal shall be accompanied by a monetary award to the value of R2500, together with a suitably inscribed scroll.

#### THE CHEMICAL EDUCATION MEDAL

The medal shall be known as the <u>The Chemical Education Medal of the South African Chemical Institute</u>. The medal is struck in silver and bears the Institute's name and crest on the obverse, and the name of the medal, together with the name of the recipient and the date on the reverse. The award shall be made to a person who has made an outstanding contribution to chemical education, as judged by the person's published work in the previous five years. Published work may be in any form and may be related to any level or educational context. The medal shall be accompanied by a suitably inscribed scroll.


#### THE SASOL CHEMISTRY INNOVATOR OF THE YEAR MEDAL

The medal shall be known as **The Sasol Chemistry Innovator of the Year Medal.** The medal is gold-plated, and bears the SASOL logo together with the inscription "Chemistry Innovator of (the year)" on the obverse and the Institute's name and crest and the name of the recipient on the reverse. The award shall be made to a person whose scientific contributions in the field of chemistry or chemical technology during the year preceding the award are adjudged to be outstandingly innovative. The award shall comprise, in addition to the medal a monetary award to the value of R20000, together with a suitably inscribed scroll. The recipient of the award shall be known as the "SASOL Chemistry Innovator of the Year". Past medalists are ineligible for nomination for a second award of the medal. Any member of the Institute may submit nominations for the award. The person submitting the nomination shall supply the following information:

- 1. A complete curriculum vitae of the candidate, detailing all academic achievements.
- 2. A motivation from at least two persons detailing why the nominee should be considered the most innovative chemist during the year under consideration.
- 3. Any relevant supporting documentation that may assist the Awards Committee in reaching a decision.
- 4. A draft outline of a citation, including personal information about the candidate, for possible use at the presentation ceremony.







## **2014 SACI Award Nominations**

The nominations for the Award shall be sent by the Awards Committee (SACI) to at least two former recipients of the Gold Medal of the South African Chemical Institute and two representatives nominated by SASOL. The recipient of the Award shall be required to deliver the SASOL Chemistry Innovator of the Year Lecture during the presentation ceremony, on a suitable occasion determined by the Council in consultation with the relevant Section Committee. Wherever practicable, the presentation ceremony and lecture shall take place during a Convention. The recipient of the Award shall be required to prepare a written form of the SASOL Chemistry Innovator of the Year Lecture, or a review based upon the subject of the lecture, for publication by the Institute/Sasol.

#### THE SASOL POST-GRADUATE MEDALS

Institute. The medals are struck in silver, and bear the SASOL logo on the obverse, and the Institute's name and crest, together with the name of the recipient and the date on the reverse. The medals shall be awarded to students engaged in research towards a MSc or PhD degree at a South African University, or a MTech or DTech degree at a South African University of Technology. The number of medals awarded shall not exceed five per annum, and the awards are limited to one per institution. The recipients of the award shall be known as The Sasol Post-Graduate Medalists. Past Sasol Post-Graduate Medalists are not eligible for nomination for a second award of the medal. The medal shall be accompanied by a monetary award to the value of R2000, together with a suitably inscribed scroll.

The persons nominated should be considered as being "young innovative chemists". The characteristics of such a person are:

- 1. Innovation.
- 2 Independence.
- 3. Enterprise.

The selection criteria applicable to the award are:

- 1. Has the candidate done something worthy of admiration in the experimental field (e.g. a new, noteworthy, experimental design)?
- 2. Has the candidate communicated the experimental results in any useful way (in printed form, or at conferences or symposia)?
- 3. Does the candidate have a broad appreciation of the role and context of chemistry as a science?





## **2014 SACI Award Nominations**

4. Does the candidate play a productive role in his/her chemistry department?

The persons submitting the nominations shall supply complete curricula vitae of the candidates, detailing all academic achievements. The group of people nominating a candidate must be able to assess the impact the nominee has made in his/her department. Hence a combined process of peer and supervisor review should inform the selection of the candidate. In addition to the backing of the supervisor, the candidate shall require the support of at least one other member of staff of the Department. The candidate must also enjoy the support of a number of fellow post-graduate research students. All the support for a candidate must be submitted in writing. The endorsements should mention how the candidate reflects the qualities enumerated in the list above. Final endorsement may reside with the Head of Department, where appropriate.

#### PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATION/APPLICATION

The merits of the work of candidates may be brought to the notice of the Council either by persons who desire to recommend candidates (nominations) or by the candidates themselves (applications).

Nominations and applications should be received by the Institute not later than 31 March 2014. Applicants must provide a list of publications, and/or non-confidential internal reports and other appropriate information in support of the application, together with curricula vitae detailing all academic and professional achievements. In the case of the Raikes medal three reprints each of those publications considered to represent the candidate's most significant work must be submitted. In the case of the Chemical Education Award copies of the publications to be considered, together with any explanatory or supporting material, must be submitted.

Each nomination or application should include the names of two persons with knowledge of the candidate's work, to whom reference may be made by the Institute.

The Council may at its discretion suspend any or all of these awards in any year in which there are no suitable candidates.





#### **Looking for speakers**


